This past year has flown by and what a very busy one it's been.

NSW athletes along with others from Queensland formed the Australian squad to the inaugural Pan Pacific Competitions in the USA a great opportunity for those athletes who had not competed overseas before it was a fantastic competition with great results. Four athletes also competed at the WBTF International Cup competition in Croatia and again with great results.

A strategy meeting in February had our committee members submitting ideas for their respective roles the one being the NSW camp. This unfortunately had to be postponed from its original date in December till April 2018 – so I hope everyone will support the camp by attending. Another was to encourage our athletes to become registered coaches and eventually judges, I have invited 9 eligible athletes to do the Level 1 Coaches course – so 3 have accepted

A performance at the Easter Show on International Twirling Day, a WBTF initiative put forward by our own Anastassia Tsaloukas – congratulations on such a great idea the videos from all around the world showcased baton twirling and the enthusiasm of the twirlers participating was fantastic to see.

Four qualifying comps, State and National championships the atmosphere at these competitions was one of enjoyment, co-operation and friendship which was great to see everyone mixing and cheering their clubs and athletes from other clubs from NSW and interstate.

This year was a rule change year and the ABTA AGM provided many great initiatives which will encourage our twirlers to learn and grow their skills in many ways – a summary will be presented within this meeting.

NSWBTA VICE-PRESIDENT'S REPORT 2017 AGM

This year for me was partly written off from the time I was diagnosed to the time I finished my treatment. So, I don't feel I have been as productive as I would have otherwise and my report is a short one.

Our busy Twirling year started with the Pan Pacific Games in January. We had a great number of athletes and clubs from our State representing Australia very successfully by getting excellent results for the world to see. I represented the NSWBTA as an Official at the Sydney Royal Easter Show, which again was very successful with all our twirlers performing the routine for the World Twirling Day made by Anastasia for the WBTF. It was a lot of fun for all involved.

One of my goals was that get a Twirling camp started in NSW. Earlier this year, after many hours of research and visits to venues, Kimberley and I started to organise the first camp for many years. Unfortunately, all the time and effort did not lead to the event this year as we couldn't be confident we would have enough support from our own Twirling Community. We needed a minimum of 25 participants and had less than half. So, it was with great disappointment we had to cancel it due to the QLD camp in January. I managed to convince the venue to keep our deposit for April 2018 instead, so that we wouldn't lose our \$500, in the hope we will be successful next time. This camp is meant to be for anyone, but more specifically for beginner twirlers, new clubs, coaches of all ability, etc. So, it is very disappointing when we do not get the interest.

It is a non-threatening, and non-competitive environment for twirlers and coaches who have the opportunity to update their skills and learn a lot in a short time with various coaches. Also, it is a way to make more friends and a lot of fun by doing other activities that are not Twirling. Please promote it within your clubs for next year.

The other area I spent time on was for our sport to be included as those targeted by the government for the \$100 membership rebate from 2018. I sent some correspondence and was told to register our sport, which I did. I will be following this up in the near future and report on its progress at a later date.

In conclusion, we have many areas in our sport that need attention and I'm happy to stand for the Vice-President position for 2018 in order to tackle whatever I can, unless someone else is interested in taking over.

Treasurers Report 2017



2017 has been a very busy year and there are no signs of it slowing down anytime soon. We have some big changes coming through next year, and lots of work still to come to see these come to fruition.

Firstly, I'd like to say Thank you to all of our NSW Judges for 2017. Your continued support for our sport is greatly appreciated and once again our competitions have run very smoothly. As a coordinator, I'm very thankful that you keep me updated with your availabilities throughout the year; it certainly makes my job a lot easier.

January saw the first WBTF Pan Pacific Cup being held, which was an amazing event. The competition was well attending by Australia with 33 athletes attending competing across all age groups, including Juvenile for the first time ever, and all events covered, including our first ever group. Congratulations to Jannette Saada who was our Judging representative from Australia for this event.

The Pan Pacific Cup is a fabulous stepping stone to all future International Representation. It gave the athletes and judges alike, an insight into what international competition is like and opened the eyes of many to the possibilities that lay ahead like International Cup or World Championships. Many of the kids have come home with a new or renewed hunger to achieve more than they thought was possible. I look forward to seeing what they can go on to achieve. Australia was very competitive at the competition with finals placements and podium finishes in many events. Congratulations to all those who attended, your hard work and dedication paid off.

Domestically, the year was kicked off with a professional development day on Standard Solo, and TAS that was open to both judges and coaches. This was a practical workshop with attendees learning the Entry Level Standard Solo. The focus of the workshop was about learning the basics and why it's so important for the

athletes' development and ensuring both coaches and judges understand their responsibilities when assessing these skills. The workshop was then followed up with a TAS grading day and Standard Solo clinic for athletes. Attendance to the Judges/Coaches workshop was light which was disappointing; however, the grading day was a success, with many athletes progressing through their levels. As you are all aware by now the TAS program has since been updated. The updated program was emailed to all clubs.

Our competition season was launched with the Rising Starz Competition, and followed up by Easts Aqua/Sutherland, Bexley and Rooty Hill hosted events. Thank you to those clubs for your support. State Championships were again a success. The competition ran smoothly thanks to the work of our competition coordinators, the announcing & music team, tabulating team and our judging team. Our visual display of set numbers at the announcing desk was once again a huge help to everyone – the athletes, judges, tabulators and the spectators. The countdown timer kept us all on track and running to schedule. I definitely missed this at nationals!

In September, we ran our NSW State Squad training session. Thank you to everyone who supported the session. It was a great day and I again had some wonderful feedback from athletes, parents and coaches. I would love to see this continue to grow and to have more coaches, judges and athletes attend. The key to our success as a sport is greater support from our twirling community.

I was honoured to accompany our President, Jan, to the ABTA AGM as a NSW delegate. The meeting was very productive and positive, as was the National Judges meeting. As a combined group, we managed to get through a mountain of agenda items. There are huge changes coming through for 2018 and I'm looking forward to these rolling out – please see attached document for a full description of these. One of the big changes will be to break down the Judges Manual into Event specific modules. This will open up the scope for new judges who only want to work or feel confident in a specific area. This will be a great change for our Judging team. The aim is to encourage more people into the judging arena.

Late October NSW Judges and coaches were thrilled to attend WBTF Judges workshops on IC and World Championship events. These workshops spanned over 2 full weekends and were presented by Jackie Stewart. This is the first time in Australia that the workshops have been opened to coaches and it was a fabulous learning experience for all who attended. Thank you ABTA & NSWBTA for bringing Jackie to Australia for this professional development opportunity.

I hope everyone enjoys their twirling break over Christmas and January and I look forward to a very productive 2018.
